- 3. Examine the impact of technology on work and employment. Using relevant examples discuss how the introduction of new technologies and automation has affected industrial relations.
- 4. "The new information technologies were developed in, by and for highly advanced capitalist economies that of the USA in particular. It is to be expected, therefore, that technologies are now being employed single-mindedly to serve market objectives." (Herbert Schiller, quoted by Traber, 1986). Discuss the above statement and examine the impact of information technology on the sovereignty of Third World countries. Provide specific and relevant examples.
