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QUESTION 6 - (10 marks)

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QUESTION 7 - (10 marks)

Three short dialogues are recorded on Side A of your cassette after the recordings for Question No. 6. Listen to the dialogues, taking notes if you wish. After each dialogue record an account of what happened in the dialogue, using reported speech whenever possible. Pay particular attention to tenses.

- (a) What happened when Thomas and his wife Martha were driving along that day?

- (b) What happened when the patient woke up in hospital after his appendicitis operation?

- (c) Give an account of the conversation between James and Sarah just before their final examination last year.

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QUESTION 8 - (10 marks)

Imagine a friend of yours who is taking this course, HEA 101, has written the following sentences. In each sentence there is one grammatical mistake. Explain to your friend why the sentence is wrong and how it should be corrected. Record your explanation after your recordings of the answer to Question 7(c).

- (a) On Wesak Day birds are being freed to celebrate liberty.
- (b) I hope you've all enjoy your first year at university.
- (c) How you all did in your first semester examinations?
- (d) He is involved in this project since January.
- (e) Did Carol glad to see Ruth?
- (f) Shall Carol be coming to Ruth's house at seven o'clock?
- (g) You have not rewind your tape.
- (h) I wish I can do it as well as you.
- (i) It was lucky I managed to escape. Otherwise I'll be dead by now.
- (j) If I knew their intentions last night I would not have agreed to meet them then.

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QUESTION 9 - (10 marks)

Do these three exercises. You may make notes on this page but do not write down every word you will say and then read it out. If you do you will receive no marks for the question.

- (a) The durian has been described as the 'King of Fruits'. Describe its taste, external and internal appearance to someone who has never set eyes on it. Record your speech.

- (b) Your instructor Miss Anne Stamford who has been with Universiti Sains Malaysia for the last nine years is leaving Malaysia for good. At a farewell dinner given in her honour, you as president of the English Language Society have been asked to give a speech. Record your speech.

- (c) As Chief Medical and Health Officer of Penang General Hospital, you have been asked to launch a 'stop smoking' campaign and to address members of your staff. Record your speech.

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QUESTION 10 - (10 marks)

In conjunction with 'Visit Malaysia Year' you and your team have been assigned to recommend a tour to the CHOGM (Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting) delegates due in Kuala Lumpur shortly. Describe what they will get to see during this tour which will last between three to four days (before their departure for home). Your speech should not exceed 5 minutes.
