- 2. Why do children have a continual fascination with the character Toad created by Kenneth Grahame in <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jhen.2007/j
- 3. Antoine de Saint Exupery's "LE PETIT PRINCE" has been translated into English by Katherine Woods without losing the impact of the original -- from its language and illustrations one might be tempted to view THE LITTLE PRINCE as just a simple child's story, but on another plane, it is a serious social commentary. To what extent would you agree with this statement?
- 4. Show how it is precisely the rhyming verse of Roald Dahl's **DIRTY BEASTS** that makes it more than just another animal story.

- 5. In Lewis Carroll's <u>ALICE'S ADVENTURES IN WONDERLAND</u>, young children can enjoy the variety of characters and their humourous antics, while older children find extra humour in its language and social comment. Discuss these aspects of the book's appeal to its readers that make it a classic.
- 6. In WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE Maurice Sendak's tempera paintings are not only skilfully synchronized with the text but also project a sense of humour and mirrors the many moods of childhood. Elaborate.
