AS IF LAST weekend's Liverpool-Manchester United clash was not anti-climatic enough, the sight of Ryan Giggs being reduced to the role of running the clock down made for a sobering Sunday night. With Paul Scholes giving another lacklustre showing and Nicky Butt red-carded at Birmingham, it's pretty obvious now that the sun has set on Alex Ferguson's Golden Generation.

David Beckham was, of course, the first to go and is still selling shirts at Real Madrid; Butt followed to Newcastle but is now calling linesmen names at Birmingham, while Phil Neville is still kicking Arsenal players even though he's gone to Everton. Big brother Gary, who will soon return from injury, is still steadfastly a Devil.

The mere fact that three remain on the pay roll suggests that Alex Ferguson feels they have yet to reach their sell-by dates and it must be remembered that the trio that left did not exactly get dumped as *paper lama*. Beckham brought the club some £25 million (RM175) just as Fergie had reached the end of his tether with him and his "baggage", while Newcastle coughed up £5m (RM35m) for Butt who was still an England player. And even the younger Neville, the perennial nearly man, fetched £3.5m (RM24.5m) from the Toffees. Although, none of the departures were universally accepted by United Fans at the time, few would argue with them now.
