- 4. With reference to the issues championed by the Indian National Congress (INC) between 1885 and 1905 evaluate the opinion that during this early period the INC did not exhibit nationalistic characteristics.
- 5. Evaluate to what extent did Gandhi succeed in infusing the principles of *ahimsa* in the Indian nationalist struggle through his "Non-Violent Non-Cooperation" movement.
- 6. "The conflict between the Hindus and Muslims in India was not because of religion but over political and economic interest." To what extent do you agree?
- 7. "It was the separatist sentiments sowed by the British in India since 1905 that ultimately brought about the beak-up of India." Discuss.
