- 2. Discuss the neuroantomical structures of the language areas of the brain and the neural pathways that are involved in speech production, reading aloud and speech comprehension.
- 3. Discuss the issue of 'Lack of Invariance' in speech perception and factors that contribute to the absence of invariance in the speech signal.

- 4. Speech errors provide indirect evidence for units, stages and cognitive computations involved in speech production. Discuss what do speech error data suggest about the process of speech production?
- 5. Discuss briefly any <u>FIVE</u> of the following terms:

 - [b] Wada Test.
 - [c] Garden Path Model.
 - [d] Categorical Perception of Voicing Contrast.
