Based on the above statement, discuss the idea of the superiority of language that was advocated by Western scholars in Medieval Europe in relation to Alexandrian Greek Literary thought.

Based on the quotation above, discuss to what extent the elements from this quotation have been transferred to Renaissance pastoral poetry with special reference to Christopher Marlowe's "The Passionate Shepherd to His Love". Base your discussion on the fact that the poem is an invitation poem.

– And therefore take note: I sentence you now to death by drowning!" (Kafka, Franz. "The Judgment," Gabriel Josipovici (ed.) *Collected Short Stories* (1993)

Discuss the moral decadence in the society that leads the father to utter the above statement? Does it have any implication on the son and the ending of the story?
