 - [b] Using suitable thinking techniques, suggest effective ways to tackle the problem.[40 marks]

3. Natural disasters such as floods, snow storms and forest fires which have been occurring since the past two years can be said to be the side effects of the American invasion of Iraq. Using scientific thinking method, offer evidence to support this hypothesis.
