 - [c] Overt and covert errors
 - [d] Language transfer

- 2. Define the term 'contrastive analysis' (CA) and the underlying assumptions of the *strong version* of the hypothesis. Explain how one goes about executing a contrastive analysis (CA) of the *vocabulary systems* of two languages [You can assume Bahasa Malaysia to be the native language (L1) and English the second language (L2) in Malaysia].
- 3. Each culture has *form, meaning* and *distribution* which could lead to cross-cultural misinformation to the observer who comes from a different cultural background. Discuss the above in the context of a culture that you know.

4. Richards (1971) states that an analysis of the major types of intralingual and developmental errors – overgeneralisation, ignorance of rule restrictions, incomplete application of rules and the building of false systems or concepts - helps us identify the major sources of difficulty faced by second language learners which cannot be accounted for by Contrastive Analysis.
