### TEKS B

#### HOW TO POISON AND KILL WITH MUSHROOMS

Mushroom poisoning is caused by the consumption of raw or cooked fruiting bodies (mushrooms, toadstools) of a number of species of higher fungi. The term toadstool (from the German *Todesstuhl*, death's stool) is commonly given to poisonous mushrooms, but for individuals who are not experts in mushroom identification there are generally no easily recognizable differences between poisonous and nonpoisonous species. Old wives' tales notwithstanding, there is no general rule of thumb for distinguishing edible mushrooms and poisonous toadstools. Most mushrooms that cause human poisoning cannot be made nontoxic by cooking, canning, freezing, or any other means of processing. Poisoning is characterized by a long latent period (range 6-48 hours, average 6-15 hours) during which the patient shows no symptoms. Death in 50-90% of the cases from progressive and irreversible liver, kidney, cardiac, and skeletal muscle damage may follow within 48 hours (large dose), but the disease more typically lasts 6 to 8 days in adults and 4 to 6 days in children.

**Dulwich College**

**The History of Dulwich College**

Dulwich College was founded by Edward Alleyn on June 21st 1619. Alleyn (who lived from 1566 to 1626) was an actor and an entrepreneur in the world of Elizabethan and Jacobean entertainment, a colourful and famous figure of his day. At the age of forty-seven in 1605 Alleyn bought the manorial estate of Dulwich for £35,000 from Sir Francis Calton who was in financial difficulties. The Dulwich estate extended, as it does today from Denmark Hill to what are now the Crystal Palace grounds on Sydenham Hill, in between the 'Lordships' Lane (indicating the manorial boundary) on the east and Croxted (meaning 'crooked street') on the west. This pleasant valley of fields, common and wooded hillside was to be frequented by William Blake and by his disciple Samuel Palmer, who called it 'the Gate into the world of vision', even in this century it was capable of sustaining the suburban paradisal vision of P G Wodehouse, the happy schoolboy, who named it 'Valley Fields' in his books and spoke of it as the setting of 'six years of unbroken bliss' at the College.

**The curriculum at Dulwich College**

Junior School — Lower School — Middle School — Upper School

The curriculum of a school consists of all the activities from which pupils learn. The basic aim of our timetabled curriculum is to develop boys' knowledge, skills, understanding of concepts, attitudes and confidence. We seek to provide a secure yet challenging environment which encourages participation, curiosity and enquiry. Boys are exposed to a wide spectrum of areas of learning (linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technological, spiritual and moral, physical, cultural, creative and social). While we rightly attach importance to a boy's intellectual development, we are no less concerned with his personal qualities, which we seek to develop through every facet of his activity at the College, inside and outside the classroom.

**Registration**

Boys are admitted to the College as day boys, from age 7, or as full or weekly boarders, from age 11. It is not the College's policy to allocate places in order of registration. While we are happy to accept earlier registrations, the usual period for receipt of applications is between September and December in the year preceding the desired date of admission.

**Registration Fee (non-returnable)**

- candidates resident in Great Britain £35
- candidates resident overseas £100

**Tuition Fees (per term)**

Junior, Middle, Lower and Upper Schools £3,410

These fees cover the use of text and library books, stationery and scientific materials, games and the school magazine subscription. For boys in the Junior and Lower School these fees also include the cost of lunch, which is compulsory. The fee for a boy attending the College for any part of a term must be paid for the whole of that term.

**Boarding Fees (in addition to tuition)**

- Full boarders £3,345 per term
- Weekly boarders £3,075 per term
