 - [d] Kevin: Oh, maybe it was from Brunei, I can't remember.
 - [e] Anita: What's she doin'
 - [f] Jane: No, I know it must've been from Brunei 'cause she was gonna work there all year.
 - [g] Anita: What's she doin' in Brunei?
 - [h] Kevin: Why do you want to know?
 - [i] Anita: I don't know, I've just been thinking about her.
 - [j] Kevin: She's on some sort of a exchange program. Working as a research assistant in the local university or somethin'.
 - [k] Anita: Lucky her.
 - [I] Kevin: Yeah. Well, I don't know. She said she was tired of working away from home and wants to come home.

- [i] In the conversation above, how many turns does each participant have?
- [ii] Define the following terms: turn-taking signal, claiming the floor, preferred response, dispreferred response, repair and trouble source. Identify an example of each in the conversation above.
