- 3. "The modern nation-states of Southeast Asia are an artificial creation of historical circumstances." [Jan Romein, 1974]. To what extent do you agree?
- 4. Nationalism and national identity in Southeast Asia is a Western phenomenon that has to yet to be fully accepted in some Southeast Asian states. With particular reference to **any two** states, explain the difficulties of bringing about an acceptable and coherent concept of national identity and nation-state faced by these states.
- 5. When the Japanese overran Southeast Asia in 1942, they had declared the 'Greater East Asia Co-Prosperity Sphere.' In truth however, the Japanese Occupation (1941-1945) merely substituted Western colonialism for Japanese colonialism. To what extent do you agree with this statement?
- 6. "Independence was far more hazardous then colonial domination." [Ariffin Omar, 1999]. With reference to **any one** Southeast Asian state, discuss why independence created more problems than did colonial domination.
