2. Analyse the following words into morphemes and explain their structure in terms of derivation, inflection, compounding, affixation and conversion. Include a brief explanation of the meaning or function of each bound morpheme.

3. "Verbs have traditionally been categorized on the basis of the number and nature of their sisters within the VP, often referred to as the 'complement(s)' of the verb" (Brown & Miller, 1980:61). Discuss some of the traditionally recognised verb classes.

4. Traditional grammars of English recognise eight parts of speech. Discuss open and closed classes in relation to these parts of speech.

5. The following observations summarise a particular issue surrounding the meaning of words:

"Words have basic inalienable meanings, departure from which is either conscious metaphor or inexcusable vulgarity" (Evelyn Waugh, in Green, 1982:254)

"Words have often been called slippery customers, and many scholars have been distressed by their tendency to shift their meanings and slide out from under any simple definition"

(Labov, 1973:34)
